

**PRETRIAL DIVERSION PROGRAM FOR DUI'S
(Orange County)**

Pretrial Diversion (PTD) is a deferred prosecution program offered by the Office of the State Attorney and supervised by Orange County Community Corrections. Successful completion of the Pretrial Diversion program will result in the dismissal of the case by the Office of the State Attorney. **This is an excellent opportunity to avoid criminal prosecution and conviction. However, not everyone qualifies for this program .**

Program Eligibility:

1. No prior alcohol-related driving offenses, regardless of disposition.
2. No prior sentence, conviction or dismissal for a similar charge. (i.e. possession of alcohol by minor)
3. No more than one prior misdemeanor sentence for a dissimilar offense.
4. No prior deferred prosecution/diversion programs.
5. No prior juvenile programs.
6. No prior felony sentences.
7. Legal residence in the United States.
8. Approval by the Office of the State Attorney. (broad discretion)

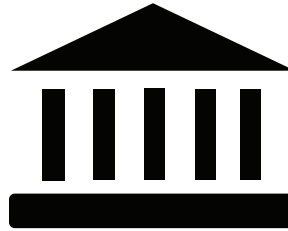

PENALTIES UPON ADJUDICATION OF GUILT

Fines

1st DUI	\$500-\$1,000
1st DUI (aggravated) or 2nd DUI	\$1,000-\$2,000
2nd DUI (aggravated)	\$2,000-\$4,000

Jail Time

1st DUI	Up to 6 months
1st DUI (aggravated) or 2nd DUI	Up to 9 months
2nd DUI (aggravated)	Up to 1 year

Driver's License Suspension

1st DUI	6 months <i>minimum</i>
2nd DUI within 5 years	5 years <i>minimum</i>
3rd DUI within 10 years	10 years <i>minimum</i>

Probation

DUI/Aggravated DUI	1 year
--------------------	---------------

Ignition Interlock Device

1st DUI	if court ordered
1st DUI (aggravated)	6 months <i>minimum</i>
2nd DUI	1 year <i>minimum</i>
2nd DUI (aggravated)	2 years <i>minimum</i>

D.U.I.—Driving or in actual physical control of a vehicle (it can be a parked car) under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance with either your normal faculties impaired or your breath or blood alcohol level above .08.

Aggravated D.U.I.—Driving under the influence with breath or blood alcohol level above .15, or the presence of a minor in the vehicle.

Note: A Judge cannot withhold adjudication in DUI cases

HIDDEN COSTS (APPROXIMATE)

Towing (Plus additional fees for every 24 hours in storage)	\$125
Attorney's Fees (private attorney) (Does not include court costs, i.e. court reporter, subpoenas, etc.)	\$1,500 <i>minimum</i>
Bail	\$150 <i>minimum</i>
DUI Class (1st offense) (\$395 for subsequent offense)	\$255
Hardship License 1st suspension by DHSMV	\$223
2nd suspension by judge (if adjudicated guilty)	\$223
Interlock Device (per vehicle owned/co-owned)	\$170 + (\$67.50 per month)
Vehicle Impound Fee (for 10 days) (per vehicle owned)	\$150
Insurance Hikes (Triple or quadruple premium costs) (Minimum liability coverage of \$100,000/person, \$300,000/accident, \$50,000 property damage) (FR-44 certificate required for 3 years)	Varies
Substance Abuse Evaluation/Treatment (Depends on result of evaluation and recommended treatment)	Varies
Community service	50 hours
State Attorney Fee/Costs	\$500
Probation Supervision Fees	\$50 (per month)
Intake	\$20
Drug Tests	\$17

ADDITIONAL HIDDEN COSTS

Transportation—With a suspended license, you will either need to utilize some form of public transportation or have a friend drive you to and from work, school, etc. This reliance on others for transportation is now an expense.

Diminished Job Opportunity/Graduate

School—Having a misdemeanor or felony on your record could determine whether or not you get a job or admitted into graduate school. Even internships can be denied if you have a misdemeanor or felony.

Student Conduct Violation— A student who is charged with a DUI is subject to disciplinary action under university rules.

In addition to a **minimum** of around **\$4,000 actual cost**, a single DUI can cost you:

- **Jail Time**
- **Probation**
- **Community Service**
- **Loss of Job**
- **Suspension From School**
- **Loss of Driving Privileges**
- **Diminished Job/Graduate School Opportunities**
